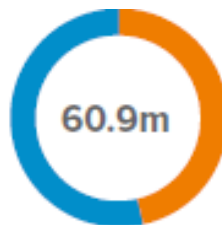
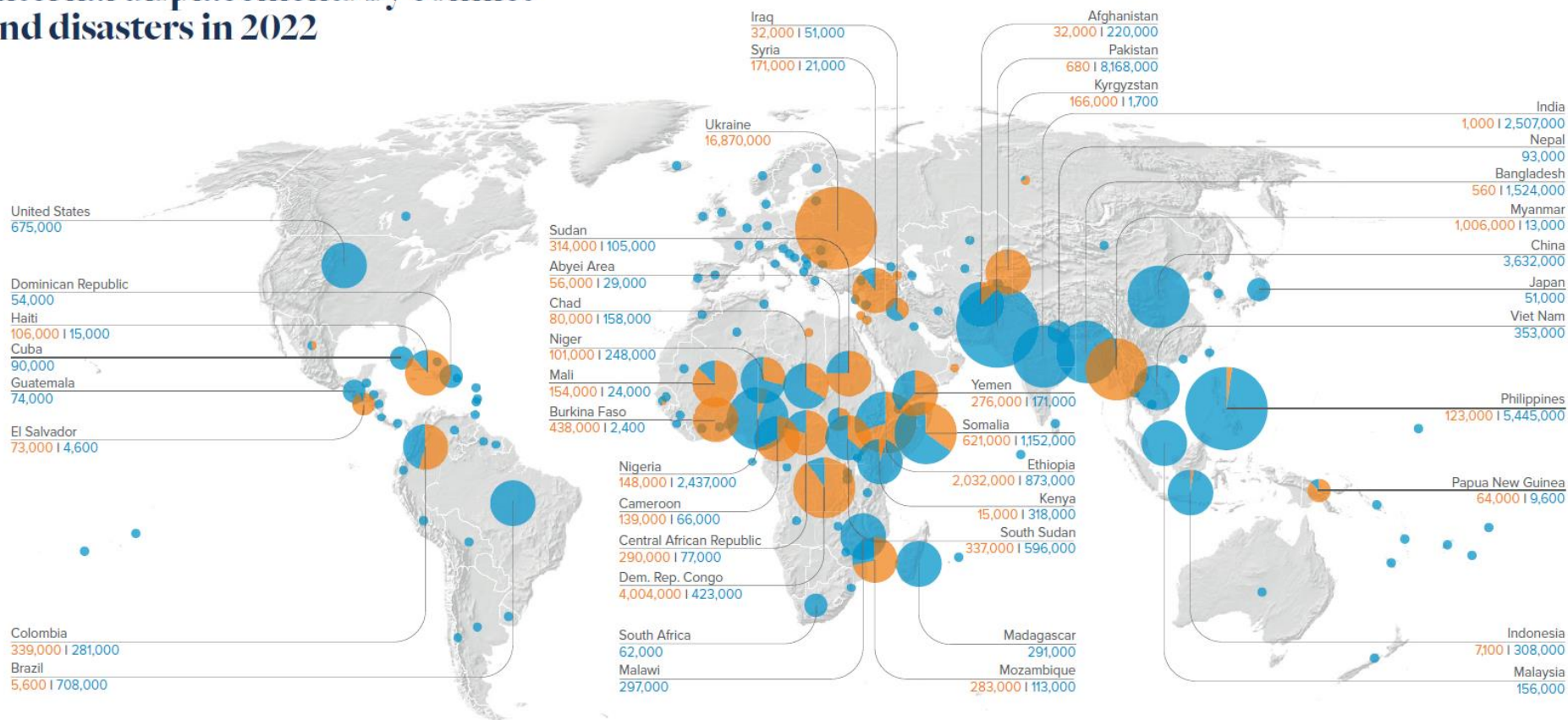

International regimes dealing with IDPs

1. **Internal Displacement Regime:** Guiding Principles + Kampala Convention + Great Lakes Protocol + Pinheiro Principles + IASC Framework on Durable Solutions
2. **IHL:** 1949 Geneva Conventions + Additional Protocols
3. **Disaster Risk Reduction Regime:** Sendai Framework + the Nansen Agenda + Words into Action guidelines on disaster displacement
4. **Climate Change Regime:** UN Framework Convention on Climate Change + Cancun Adaptation Framework + Paris Agreement + Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage Associated with Climate Change Impacts.
5. **Sustainable Development Regime:** 2030 Agenda + New Urban Agenda

Prevention and Preparedness:

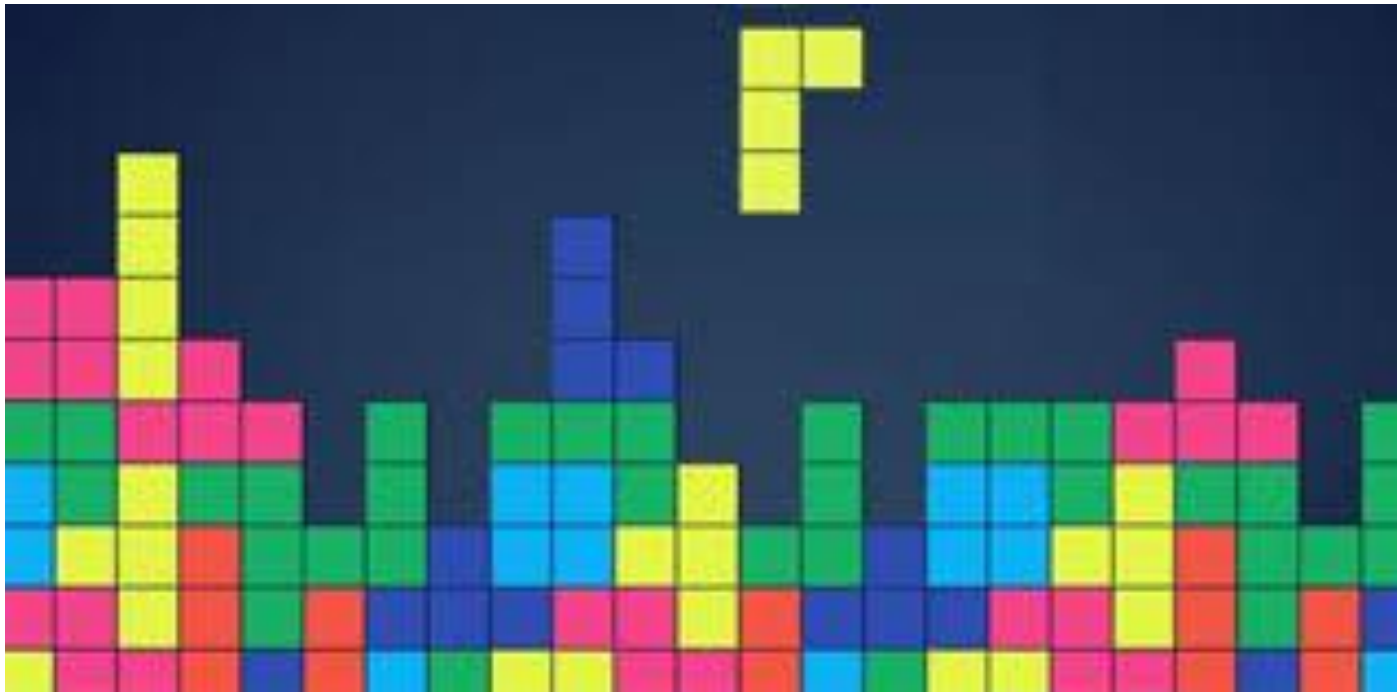
